Registration will not be accepted without full payment, except when you are requesting a need-based scholarship.

## **Dismissal Procedures**

**Parents/guardians are responsible for picking up their children on time at the end of class from the program teacher or designated monitor.** If parents/ guardians cannot pick up a child on time they should arrange with a friend, neighbor or family member for a timely pick up. If a child is not picked up at the end of class the program teacher, monitor, or administrator will contact parents using the emergency contact number(s) to make arrangements for pick up. After waiting ten minutes, the teacher or monitor will proceed with the following emergency protocol. At no time will a program teacher or monitor leave a student without adult supervision.

1. After waiting ten minutes the teacher or monitor may turn the child over to the Beye Elementary School office who will continue to call parents at their emergency numbers to arrange for pick up.
2. If the office is closed or if the office cannot reach a parent/guardian before closing, Jonathan Ellwanger, Principal of Beye School, should be called on his cell phone.
3. If Mr. Ellwanger cannot be reached, the call of last resort should be to the Oak Park Police Department at 708-386-2131 for assistance.

If parents/guardians arrive consistently late for pickup, the student will no longer be able to participate in the class. Working together we hope that these procedures and protocols will never have to be utilized. They exist to insure that students will always be safe and supervised.
